They are a vital partner to our shelter. They have helped us gain insight and training on running a no-kill shelter. They also are helping with our TNR efforts in our community! We have a goal of fixing 200 owned pets and 200 feral/neighborhood cats in Sumner County to be fixed in 2023! As of early October, we are up to 148 owned pets and 129 TNR cats. If you have a feral colony near you in Sumner County, be sure to fill out our survey on our website (www.wellingtonhumanesociety.org/tnr) and we will reach out to you to start trapping them. The Caldwell Police Department is currently working with us for their TNR needs.
