loves running here on the farm and has made friends with the cattle and the horses. We recently took her in our plane, and she had her mutt muffs on to protect her ears. She really loved it!

When we brought her home, she was afraid of Bruce and actually all men, but with patience and guidance and training she is doing so well! I never planned on her sleeping with us, but she had other plans.

MJ was adopted in early January, and his new family sent us this update:

"He's fitting in so good!

## Three Reasons to Adopt Instead of Shopping

These three boys are only 6-9 months old and have already been through a lot! They are now safe and being cared for at our shelter. They will have weeks of recovery time to undo what someone has done to them.

Their initial fecal matter and vomit contained lots and lots of small rocks, presumably eaten



We have bathed them, treated them with meds, and picked countless ticks off of them. One has an injured toe that is basically missing.

And they are still sweet and give you kisses!

These dogs didn't have a chance in the country by them-

selves! Someone was so impatient and cruel that they didn't wait on an opening in a shelter, and they just dumped them. As a result, they will require more time and treatment before they can be adopted.

These three dogs are just three examples of the hard work required of our staff and volunteers.
They teach some of the animals how to walk on three legs instead of four.



Or quietly pet an animal for days and days to get them to trust a person after what another person has done to them.

Or love on each one until they can finally find that perfect forever home—and then silently weep with joy as the animal leaves the shelter.



Terrance got to visit students at Lincoln Elementary in Wellington. Thank you, Lincoln, for having us out!


